Errata

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The authors have requested the following additions and changes to their manuscript published in the January/February issue of *Pain Physician*. Korkmazsky et al. Feasibility study of rapid opioid rotation and titration. *Pain Physician* 2011;14:71-82.

An acknowledgment was left out of the manuscript:

Under "Results", the 4th sentence contains a repeated phrase. The phrase should read

"Based on a linear mixed effects model analysis, higher baseline emotional health, as measured by the SF-36 Mental Component Score (MCS≥50), was associated with greater reduction in pain over 3 months."

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In Zhu et al. Alternative approach to needle placement in spinal cord stimulator trial/implantation technique. *Pain Physician* 2011;14;45-53. The text supporting the images was incorrect. The text for Figures 2 and 4 at the A point should be the TII spinous process. Bottom of page 4 should read:

"The target point, which is slightly caudal to the T11 spinous process (Figs. 2 and 4, A point) of the interlaminar space, is marked on the skin using a sterile skin marker.
